Program Launch - Cultural Directions

Gosford Regional Community Services are launching Cultural Directions, an exciting program with an emphasis on promoting unity and understanding within our community. The focus is to develop pathways to resilience through cultural conversations and to oversee the benefits of our cultural diversity implemented in Educational Studies.

Formally the Central Coast Multicultural Resource Centre, Cultural Directions have stepped it up and created a specialised hub for educators and families to find cultural information which is rich in authenticity and meaning.

Kathy Sokk, Chief Executive Officer of Gosford Regional Community Centre, says "we have a commitment to promoting diversity, understanding and tolerance in all areas of endeavour and any organisation delivering an educational program to children and/or families is eligible to become a member".

"The primary objective is to provide for the diversity in Australian society, enabling each person to participate fully in our multicultural society, realise their personal aspirations, and benefit Australia". Kathy explains, "Educators will be able to borrow quality and unique educational resources to support EYLF and curriculum outcomes".

Our two exciting new programs are: Achieve School Success which is a four, 3-hour session parenting workshop developed to support parents from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds as they navigate the Australian system across the primary years, and the Cultural Experience Program which is an interactive & immersive program that allows children to learn about one of the many cultures represented in our community.

Cultural Directions will partner with pre-schools, long day care, primary schools and local cultural organisations to deliver these programs on the lower Central Coast with the intention of expanding the program in future years.

Are you at risk of losing your licence due to unpaid fines?

Do you have other unpaid debts with the NSW Government?

What is a Work and Development Order?

Work and Development Orders (WDO) assist eligible people to satisfy their fine debt through unpaid work with an approved organisation or by undertaking certain courses or treatment.

A WDO can only be made if an application is supported by an approved organisation, such as Gosford Regional Community Services, or in the case of medical/mental health treatment, a health practitioner qualified to provide that treatment. Fines are satisfied (paid off) at a rate that is dependent on the activity. The rate that will apply will be dependent on individual.

This free service is by appointment only.

Eligibility

can include homelessness, acute economic hardship, mental illness or disability or serious addiction to drugs/alcohol.

Activities

The types of activity can include one or more of the following:

- unpaid voluntary work for, or on behalf of, an approved organisation
- medical or mental health treatment or drug or alcohol treatment in accordance with a health practitioner's treatment plan
- educational, vocational or life skills course; financial or other counselling
- a mentoring program (only if you are under 25 years of age).









FAMILY DRUG SUPPORT

A SUPPORT GROUP FOR THE FAMILIES AND FRIENDS OF PEOPLE WHO HAVE PROBLEMS WITH DRUG OR ALCOHOL USE

Are you concerned about the drug or alcohol use of someone close to you? Are you fearful, angry and desperate or worrying about how you will cope?

Anyone in any family unit can develop a problem with drugs or alcohol, and those people closest to them are often seriously impacted. If this is you, come and join us at Family Drug Support meetings in WYOMING. There is no cost for attending the meetings.

- Learn coping skills
- Understand more about drug and alcohol dependence
- Learn how best to support someone experiencing problems with drugs or alcohol
- Gain support for yourself and other family members

The group provides a free, confidential and safe place for anyone supporting someone with a drug or alcohol issue. Family Drug Support has provided specialist support and care for over 18 years to families coping with isolation, helplessness, shame and stigma.


